From the Pastor's Desk:

Having a conversation with a Sikh friend this week, I was surprised when he showed interest in the mission trip to the Philippines myself and others will be going on in January. He spoke of how he and his family and other friends raised money on a regular basis to help the needy. While I was excited to tell him of what we hope can begin to be achieved through this trip and would be pleased to have their help, I was also very aware of the different motivations behind what we both see as a very worthwhile endeavour. For him as a Sikh, good deeds bring merit and reward from their god. However, as Christians we understand that it's out of God's goodness in Jesus that we have already received everything we need and therefore give as a demonstration of how God breaks into people's lives by faith in all Jesus has done. Essentially we give not to get but to tell the story of Christ who has given His all, seen by the actions of our lives and the words which we speak. For the Sikh too, their giving is not as an action to declare the goodness of their god to others but to increase their own position before their god. For us as followers of Jesus, the great pleasure we have is not only to do good deeds but to invite people into the greatest relationship and only hope for life eternal. That is, we both demonstrate and declare Jesus as the saviour of people's soul. Many people seek to do good deeds but unless we can point to a good God and a great Saviour, we do good to satisfy our personal need to feel worthy. Friends, in Jesus you are already worthy. From that point, give and help others so that they too might find living worth in Jesus.
