8 weeks for 1

In the book of John in the 17th Chapter we discover this prayer from the mouth of Jesus, "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

Church unity, church family is often discussed but is for some reason often found wanting within the church. Wentworthville Baptist Church is a church made up of people, who in many ways are very different, so how are we to be "one" with such variety?

Over the next 8 weeks we will be celebrating what it means to be "one" together. This will include our regular Sunday teaching, perhaps with a bit of a twist, a weekly devotion and an action for us to embrace to help solidify a particular aspect of unity. The leadership will also be engaging each weeks teaching and asking each other what this means for our service to the church.

I covet your prayers over these next 2 months as we search the Scriptures to find how we might apply true unity...oneness...to our family life as God's children in Wentworthville.

Christ's Servant and Yours Rick

will praise you, O LORD, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonders. — Psalm 9:1

Devotional:

Over the next 8 weeks we will have a short passage to listen and seek God in for a greater understanding of **Oneness**. If this isn't something you're used to doing, please make a special effort over these weeks to seek what God is saying to you and us as the church. For your help, I suggest you read the whole passage each day beginning with prayer, it could be as simple as, "speak God, your servant is listening". After reading the passage ask yourself what questions you have, and if it helps write them down. Then you might write down what is most highlighted for you in the passage, or at least think on what stands out the most. Lastly, you might ask how the passage challenges a particular thought, action or belief you might have and what you might see changed because of the challenge from the passage of Scripture. If there is a genuine desire for change to take place in your heart, I suggest you finish by asking God to guide you into a process of change. You might like to write down your prayers and you may even find discussing your thoughts with someone a very helpful part of the process. As the pastor I'm always willing to be a person you might contact but I understand this may be difficult, so another Christian friend may be a place you can go. If during your reading you feel a strong sense that God is saying something particular to you (perhaps prophetic) make sure you note it down as He may want you to speak this out at some point. If their is a particular Word for the church that you sense God is asking you to share, please come and see me or one of the elders to discuss...test the spirit.
