From the Pastors Desk:

Unhelpfully people can assume questioning God and His purposes in their life, to be a lack of faith. The thinking goes like this: If I don't question or complain about what is happening in my life, my faith must be high. If I do question and complain about my circumstances, then my faith must be low. This thinking is both simplistic and without biblical merit. Complaints to God are found throughout the Bible, particularly within the Psalms and well and truly throughout the book of Job. Do we assume that David and Job were struggling with a lack of faith when they cry out to God? What can be helpful in understanding what constitutes low faith or high faith, is to add into the mix, low communion and high communion with God. If for example, life's complexities has me concerned and drive me towards meeting with God, in His Word & through prayer, you could say I was experiencing a winter season in my faith. In fact this is where I currently find myself. On the other hand, if the winds and waves of this life lead me to travel away from God, avoiding Him in prayer and leaving my Bible to gather dust. I will carry around faith that is **spiritually critical**. Balancing this out... if I were to be experiencing a great season in life, where all I do is praise God for everything and find myself constantly praying and discovering new things from His Word, you could say I was enjoying a **summer season** of faith. However, I could be loving life without a care in the world, and as a Christian still avoid any meaningful time with my Heavenly Father, and be living life as a disengaged believer. To automatically assume any person struggling with their life's situations has a lack of faith, can cause great harm. Ultimately, all of creation is broken because of sin, this should leave us with a sense of dissatisfaction... and something to complain about. Whom we complain and give praise **TO**, constitutes either low or high faith. As a church we should be encouraging each other into greater communion with God, where faith in Him carries us through the mountain top and valley experiences of this life. What season of faith are you in right now, summer...winter? Are you finding vourself spiritually critical or disengaged from faith? Whatever the case, our leaders are always ready and willing to pray with you. — Faithfully Yours

Iran | 10 Arrested at Engagement Ceremony

On 24 June an engagement ceremony in Iran was raided by security agents. While ten people were initially arrested, all but four were released.
