

SAUDI ARABIA | Finding Christ in Mecca

This week the world watches on as millions of Muslims take part in one of the largest religious rituals in the world. During the annual Hajj Pilgrimage, Muslims follow the footsteps of their prophet Mohammed and journey to Mecca, Saudi Arabia. They pray, worship and bring sacrifices to receive forgiveness for their sins. It can be a tense time for Christians living in the Middle East.

GOD AT WORK

"It is unnatural - maybe even wrong - to keep one's love for Jesus entirely to oneself. I cannot tell my wife. Or my children. Or my parents. I found Christ in a dream, and only He knows I follow him. But I have to, or I'm dead." Last year, Jesus appeared in a dream to a Saudi man who was making the Hajj. He travelled abroad and secretly read the New Testament. He gave his heart to Jesus. But even taking the Bible back into Saudi Arabia could cost him his life.

"It's too risky. If the authorities find a Christian Bible on my person, they will interrogate me, and I will not lie, so my new faith would be exposed. I do not know how long I can go without fellowship, without witness, living a lie."

PRAYER POINTS

- Pray for Muslims who will meet Jesus during the pilgrimage, like this brother! Pray they can find fellowship.
- Pray for Christians to be freely able to read the Bible and worship in Saudi Arabia.
- Pray for the protection of Christians during the time of Hajj, that those who
 experience persecution will endure and be led to forgive their persecutors.



ETHNIC THAI

One of the Faith Community leaders has been opening up to **Luke and Belle** about her life struggles and the concerns she has for her children. They feel honoured at this demonstration of trust and are praying that she will experience God's grace and peace through the difficulties. Luke and Belle continue their culture and language lessons and are encouraged to notice a growth in their confidence and willingness to initiate and engage in conversation. Following the Team Leaders' conference in Thailand, National Director **Mark** is involved in the upcoming training for Ethnic Thai Faith Community leaders.

For Prayer:

- Wisdom for Luke and Belle as they journey with their Ethnic Thai friend and seek to share God's love with her in the midst of her difficulties
- God's grace as Luke and Belle open their family home to community visitors at any time
- Continued steady progress of language skills and cultural understanding so they can share the message of Jesus in a way that makes sense to the Ethnic Thai
- Leadership training to be a valuable time of open dialogue and spiritual insight

PAPUA NEW GUINEA

Geoff and Lyn are currently in Papua New Guinea. Tomorrow they fly to Telefomin to assist in training for church and ministry leaders. The work of the Baptist Union of PNG is being severely impacted at the moment by Australian Aid funding cuts to the Church Partnership Program. Staff numbers have reduced from over 100 to less than 30 over the past year. Some staff have chosen to work as volunteers but a broad range of church and community programs are affected. These funding cuts are impacting all of the seven mainline denominations. The translation of the Kyaka Enga Bible continues to progress well and **Susan and Henry** have returned to their roles at the Theological College for the current time.

For Prayer:

- Training of trainers to be a time of spiritual growth and leadership development for local people
- Wisdom for leaders as they respond to financial challenges
- Spirit's guidance for the Bible translation team, enabling them to translate God's Word in a modern, accurate and understandable way for the Enga people

THAILAND

After much prayer and planning, **Jit** will launch a 'men's shed' next week. He extended the invitation to many and there has been a good response. Jit and **Jan** hope this will be a way to further build meaningful connections within the community and be another avenue to share their lives and God's love with those around them.

For Praver:

- Men's shed to be a safe and welcoming place where spiritual conversations can occur
- God's love to be demonstrated through words and actions

KHMER

Recently, **Catherine's** Mother passed away and as Catherine reflects on the journey of the past months, she is in awe and humbled by the way she has experience God's love, mercy and compassion. She is also very grateful for the love and care those around her have offered her and her family. She is currently on a leave of absence before returning to Cambodia early next year. During this time she will be resting, healing, studying part-time at university and building her partnership team.

For Prayer:

- Catherine to know God's peace and love as she grieves
- Study to practically enhance the skills and knowledge she brings to Cambodia
- God to be opening doors in order for the candidates preparing to serve in Cambodia to join the team
